Operation of TBU Catering Facilities from 1 November 2021 Onwards due to COVID-19

- 1) Tomas Bata University in Zlín (hereinafter referred to as “TBU”) prohibits the entry of a diner (hereinafter referred to as a “person”) into the indoor and outdoor areas of catering facilities if he/she shows clinical signs of the COVID-19 disease or, with the exemption of children under the age of 12, does not meet the requirements listed below:
 - a) the person evidences a negative result of an RT-PCR screening test for the detection of the presence of SARS-CoV-2 virus carried out in the last 72 hours, or
 - b) the person evidences a negative result of a rapid antigen test (RAT) for the detection of the presence of SARS-CoV-2 virus carried out by a healthcare professional in the last 24 hours, or
 - c) the person has been vaccinated against the COVID-19 disease and provides evidence of this fact by presenting a national vaccination certificate or a certificate issued in accordance with the European Union Regulation on the EU digital COVID certificate, provided that at least 14 days have elapsed since the vaccination regimen was completed; a national certificate of vaccination refers to a written confirmation issued at least in English by an authorized entity operating in a third country, a template of which is included in the list of recognized national certificates posted on the website of the Ministry of Health of the Czech Republic; the written confirmation must include details of the person vaccinated, the type of vaccine administered, the date the vaccine was administered, the identification of the entity which issued the certificate, and all data must be verifiable by remote access directly from the written confirmation, provided that vaccination was carried out using
 - i) a medicinal product containing a vaccine against COVID-19 which has been granted a marketing authorization in accordance with the Regulation (EC) No. 726/2004, or
 - ii) a medicinal product the manufacture of which complies with the patent of the medicinal product referred to in Clause (i), provided that the medicinal product has also been approved by the World Health Organization for emergency use; or
 - d) the person has already had the COVID-19 disease which has been confirmed by a laboratory and his/her isolation period has expired in accordance with the extraordinary measure issued by the Ministry of Health and currently in force, and no more than 180 days have elapsed since the first positive rapid antigen test (RAT) for the detection of the presence of SARS-CoV-2 virus antigen or since the RT-PCR test for the detection of the presence of SARS-CoV-2 virus, or
 - e) the person undergoes an onsite rapid antigen test (RAT) for the detection of the presence of SARS-CoV-2 virus antigen and intended for self-testing (to be used by non-professionals) with a negative result; the same shall apply if the student demonstrates on the spot that he/she has undergone a rapid antigen test under the supervision of a healthcare professional via an online service no more than 24 hours ago and evidences passing of this test and its negative result by presenting a confirmation issued by the health service provider, or
 - f) the TBU employee has carried out a self-test directly at TBU in accordance with the Rector's Decree and has a confirmation of the negative test result issued by the TBU employee in charge.

- 2) The fulfilment of requirements listed in Clause 1 shall be checked at the entrance to catering facilities, persons are obliged to provide evidence of having fulfilled the requirements listed in Clause 1; a person who fails to provide evidence of having fulfilled the requirements at the entrance, shall not be allowed to enter the TBU catering facilities.
